8. Section 4959 of the Code allows the Board to request that the proposed decision of an administrative law judge in resolution of any disciplinary proceeding before the Board include a direction that the licensee found guilty of unprofessional conduct pay the Board the actual and reasonable costs of investigation and prosecution of the case.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Conviction of a Crime; Dishonest Acts)

- 9. On March 7, 2019, an Indictment was filed against Respondent in the United States District Court for the Northern District of California. The Indictment charged Respondent with numerous crimes arising out of his billing for treatment of patients insured through their employment with the United States federal government, or through membership in a labor union. From at least February 2013 through June 2018, Respondent submitted numerous false or misleading claims for acupuncture services. Claims artificially inflated the type of services patients received and the time spent with patients, and billed for services not rendered. In one instance, Respondent billed for reimbursement for more than 24 hours of acupuncture services in one single day, when he was not physically present in the United States.
- 10. Respondent entered into a Plea Agreement under which he agreed to plead guilty to multiple felony charges contained in the Indictment. Respondent agreed to a wide range of misconduct that occurred over a period of at least five years. The admissions included that Respondent knowingly and willfully executed and attempted to execute a scheme and plan to defraud healthcare benefit program by means of materially false and fraudulent pretenses, representations and omissions in connection with the delivery of or payment for health care benefits, items and services. For example, Respondent billed for time not spent with patients, submitted claims for services rendered on days when patients were not seen by him at all, and submitted claims for services on days when he was not physically present in the United States. He falsely and inaccurately billed for treatments not provided, billed under other patient's names to obtain reimbursement, and submitted CPT codes he believed were least likely to be reduced or rejected by insurance companies. On March 13, 2020, Judgment was entered pursuant to the Plea
